Milestones in African American Healthcare to be Recognized with New Sign on the Champaign County African American Heritage Trail

Champaign, IL—The Champaign County African American Heritage Trail and the Experience Champaign-Urbana Foundation will unveil the 23rd trail sign in downtown Champaign at 29 E. Main St. on Wednesday, August 27, at 11:00 a.m. *Media are encouraged to attend*.

This sign celebrates Dr. Henry E. Rowan, the first African American doctor to practice in Champaign-Urbana who arrived in the area in 1914 and had an office on Walnut St. in downtown Champaign. Dr. Henry (Harry) D. Ellis, was the second African American doctor in Champaign-Urbana, who attended the University of Illinois School of Medicine after returning from serving in the 370th Infantry in World War I. The sign also recognizes Black female health workers, including Vivian Grundy, the first African American allowed in a local nursing program in 1952.

Clinics that served community members are also recognized, including the North End Health Center, which later became the Frances Nelson Health Center in honor of the woman who provided care and housing to homeless African American children in the 1940s.

This sign is generously sponsored by Carle Health.

This sign marks a major milestone, the completion of Phase 1 of the trail's development. As we look ahead to Phase 2, we'll continue exploring additional sign locations as new research is completed and funding is secured to expand trail programming.
